The bald eagle isn't really bald. It has dark brown and white feathers.




The bald eagle has a hooked yellow beak and large talons.




The bald eagle likes to catch and eat fish from lakes and rivers.

The eyes of an eagle can see four to seven times farther than ours!




Bald eagles live in forests, near large bodies of water.
